Marine Turtle Conservation and Environmental Education as Tools for Community Mental Health.

La conservación de las tortugas marinas, en combinación con la educación ambiental, se ha demostrado como una estrategia eficaz no solo para proteger a estas especies vulnerables, sino también para promover la salud mental de las comunidades locales. La relación entre la naturaleza y el bienestar psicológico es un campo de estudio que ha ganado atención en las últimas décadas, especialmente en regiones donde las personas interactúan directamente con el medio ambiente. El cuidado de las tortugas marinas no solo implica la protección de un recurso natural valioso, sino que también puede ser un camino hacia el fortalecimiento de la resiliencia colectiva y el fomento de una comunidad más saludable emocionalmente.

Las tortugas marinas, especies clave en los ecosistemas marinos, enfrentan diversas amenazas como la caza furtiva, la destrucción de su hábitat, la contaminación y el cambio climático. La conservación de estas especies no solo es crucial para la biodiversidad, sino también para la salud del medio ambiente, lo cual tiene un impacto directo en las personas que dependen del mar para su sustento. La protección de las tortugas implica la restauración de playas, la reducción de desechos plásticos y el establecimiento de áreas de anidación seguras, lo que genera un ambiente más saludable tanto para las especies como para las personas.

En este contexto, la educación ambiental juega un papel clave. Al involucrar a las comunidades locales en programas educativos sobre la importancia de las tortugas marinas y el ecosistema marino en general, se fomenta un sentido de conexión con la naturaleza. Las personas que entienden el impacto que sus acciones tienen sobre el medio ambiente suelen desarrollar una mayor conciencia ecológica, lo que a su vez reduce el estrés y la ansiedad. El simple hecho de saber que sus esfuerzos están contribuyendo a la conservación de especies vulnerables puede generar un sentido de propósito y satisfacción personal, lo cual es un factor protector para la salud mental.

He studied L.R.C. with a specialization in C.I. at the I.P.N., and one of his greatest achievements has been founding one of the largest conservation and regenerative ecotourism organizations on the coast of Oaxaca: VIVE M.A.R. (Mangroves, Birds, and Reptiles).

His work has proven that the fight against wildlife exploitation was not in vain. Environmental advocates have long argued that natural resources are more valuable alive than dead, and today, that belief stands as his legacy. Through his efforts, he has created jobs within the community by protecting coastal ecosystems, particularly marine turtles, helping to restore their populations through non-extractive conservation efforts and raising awareness about the importance of preserving collective heritage.




